

ESSERF 3

The ARP ESSER 3 funding application requires that each school develop a plan for the safe return of students and staff to in-person learning and to ensure the continuity of educational services for the upcoming year.

The school must reserve at least 20 percent of the total ESSER 3 funds to “address the lost instructional time...and to respond to students’ academic, social, and emotional needs and address the disproportionate impact of COVID-19 on student subgroups.” The remaining funds can be used to address needs related to the COVID pandemic to “effectively maintain the health and safety of students, educators and staff...”

Once the application is approved, funds can be accessed through September 30, 2024 (this includes a 12 month Tydings Amendment).

Projects to Address Learning Loss

- Extended School Day for the School Years 2021, 2022, and 2023 in the amount of \$25,948.
- Summer Programming for the Summer of 2021 and 2022 in the amount of \$17,000.
- High-Quality Tutoring for the School Year 2021 in the amount of \$60,000.
- Of the required 92,947.94 the School Department is required to allocate to projects addressing learning loss, we have exceeded the allocation by 10,000.06.

Projects to help operate the School during COVID-19, remaining ARP ESER funds

- School Facilities \$120,000
- Playground Project \$120,000
- PE and Sports with Outdoor Project \$16,800
- Technology \$59,991.72
- Instructional supplies to accommodate student needs \$45,000
